Wednesday Night Live - Praxis

Discover the Enneagram with us! We'll spend Wednesday Night Live from September 15 - October 20 exploring the Enneagram. We'll have a food truck each Wednesday from 5-6:30pm. Programming begins at 6:30.

The Enneagram has roots in several wisdom traditions, including Christianity, Judaism, and Islam. But it was not until the late 1960s that Oscar Ichazo began teaching the Enneagram in its current form. Today this system is widely taught as a way of understanding personality, addiction, relationships, and vocation.

The Enneagram combines traditional wisdom with modern psychology to help us better understand ourselves and the people in our lives. The nine archetypal types ALL live within us, but by discovering our dominant type we can gain insights that allow us to more accurately see ourselves. This powerful tool can be used to increase personal and professional effectiveness, improve self awareness and emotional intelligence, understand patterns of thinking, feeling and behaving, build more successful relationships at home and at work, support one's strengths, identify blind spots and manage personal reactivity, and develop one's inner life.

Join Rev. Tamara and fellow Praxis classmates as we delve into this fascinating tool for self awareness and spiritual development.
