The spirit of hope and excitement was palpable as we came together in our parking lot for our first in-person worship (outside of our cars) in over a year. I imagine the uplifting sounds of "Hallelujah Chorus" will be ringing in our ears for some time. Whether or not you were able to join us, I hope you see this worship gathering as a tangible sign of the Resurrection for our community of faith.

As we move into the Easter season, we will continue to see signs of new life around our church building. We will now have an outdoor, in-person worship service at 10:00 on Sunday mornings. We are pleased that our recently purchased sound system provides a high-quality experience for listening to both speakers and musicians. We learned last Sunday that it is a good idea to wear sunscreen, bring an umbrella or hat for shade, and come with water! During our worship time on Sunday mornings, we are excited to offer faith formation programming for our preschoolers - 5th graders (more information inside).

As we get into the warmer months ahead, we will plan to move the start time for worship earlier to take advantage of the cooler morning weather. We will communicate this change in advance of the change happening. Please also note that we will continue to offer online worship that will be available on our YouTube channel even as we return to in-person gatherings. Recorded worship will include the sermon, music, and prayers.

Along with in-person, outside worship gatherings, we are also pleased to be able to offer the opportunity for small gatherings to resume in the church building. (continued on reverse)

Groups who gather in the building will be required to register in advance and follow COVID building use policies for the sake of ensuring the safety of staff and group participants. We will also have an outdoor meeting space available for groups to use under the entryway by the Memorial Garden on the east side of the building. We will encourage the use of this space for small gatherings whenever possible, as outdoor gatherings still remain the safest option.

It is a joy to see new life springing up around us. In the buds beginning to form on the trees and the flowers emerging from the soil. In the chirping of birds to the scurrying of rabbits. Easter Offering

Each year our Outreach Ministry Group selects an organization or mission for which we collect a special Easter Offering. This year, we are supporting immigrant students who are applying for residency under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. This year, we raised \$2,090 that will benefit first-time DACA applicants by providing grants for the \$495 application fee.



At the end of March, we gathered on the Poudre River Trail corridor for an evening trail walk, honoring the Spring Equinox - a time when the light and the darkness are in perfect balance. It was a time to explore and honor the balance of light and dark in ourselves as perfect, as well. 31 people participated in this ritual together and a glorious sunset bid us farewell as we left the trail at the end of the event!

Kids Faith Formation

We're so excited to welcome our families back to the church to offer outdoor faith formation programs for our kids during worship each week! Following the children's moment, our teacher companions will gather and escort kids to Sunday School. Kids ages

3-Kindergarten will meet in the courtyard outside the Sanctuary & our 1st-5th grade students will gather in the covered entryway area on the east side of the building near the memorial garden. Adults can pick up their children on the south lawn after worship.

We're looking forward to using an exciting new curriculum for our 1st-5th group called Holy Troublemakers & Unconventional Saints. We'll learn about people from different faiths and eras working for more love and justice in their corners of the world, even when that means rocking the religious boat. In particular, the material focuses on the stories of women, the LGBTQ+ community, people of color, Indigenous people, and others who are too often written out of religious narratives. These stories move us towards more love and a faith that works for the common good of us all. We hope you'll join us! We will be wearing masks, sanitizing, and maintaining social distancing as much as possible during our time together.

This marks a significant new phase of experimenting how best to offer our programs as we begin to gather in person again. Thank you for your support as we continue to evaluate these offerings and try new things.

After beginning our Sunday Morning Conversations on Race in July of 2020, the group has finally completed the UCC curriculum. For 6 weeks, beginning Thursday, April 15th at 5:00pm via Zoom, we will dig deeper into Greeley's history and listen for the voices on the margins.
