Weld Food Bank Backpack Program

The Backpack Program provides food for children who are at risk for hunger over the weekend. The Food Bank works with school counselors and teachers to identify students who are in great need of food and provide



them with shelf-stable milk, juice, a high protein meal, and three or four snacks to take home on Fridays. A \$100 donation supports one student for the school year. Our goal is to support 101

students this year, and we are about three quarters of the way there. You may mail donations to the church office or give online using the smart phone app Givelify.

- The Cold Weather Shelter is a program that feeds people who are homeless throughout the winter months. Our church provides meals every Friday during the season. We have five teams, and each team provides meals for as many as 80 people on one Friday a month. The meals are often crockpot meals, but each team decides what they want to serve. In the past, each team would also serve the meal they have prepared, but with COVID still a risk factor, we will only be dropping off food for the shelter this year. This program typically runs from November to April and is a monthly commitment. Some of our teams are looking for volunteers to join them. Farewell and Thank-You, Carol Thompson

What a year of transitions it's been for us at First Congregational! This month we say good-bye to our beloved Carol Thompson, who has managed our office for 15 years. Through ups and downs, several ministers, dozens of staff transitions and seismic societal changes (e.g. a global pandemic), Carol brought organization, competency and a cheerful presence to our front office.

As her most recent (and last) supervisor, I cannot fully describe what a pleasure it has been to work with Carol. But here are a few items:

- She can spell—just about any word I could think of!
- She can type faster than anyone I know.
- She has prevented more errors of omission and commission than I can count—and some I doubt I even knew about.
- Carol listened when any staff member needed to vent or just talk to someone who cares.
- She guarded confidences with integrity.
- She interfaced with hundreds of volunteers, vendors, community leaders, visitors, service providers, inspectors and delivery people—always keeping her cool except for a very few occasions when keeping one's cool did not serve the higher purpose.
- She cannot leap over tall buildings with a single bound, but we never actually tested that.
- When something needed to be done, it was done—done well and done on time.
- Occasionally things got done that I didn't know needed doing!
- If she didn't know something, she found out or learned how.
- She was sometimes invisible. By that I mean, when the church is running smoothly, not many people notice. The bulletins are correct and placed where expected, the office is run with efficiency, publications are produced accurately and predictably, the rest of the staff has the support they need to do their jobs. Often behind the scenes, leading and supporting our well-functioning office, was Carol.

Given our distancing constraints, we are not encouraging people to drop by the office. But we wish her well and offer our deepest gratitude for her special ministry among us.
