Soccer Without Borders Volunteer Opportunities

We recently welcomed Soccer Without Borders into one of our downstairs spaces and are excited not only to have them as renters, but also as community partners! Soccer Without Borders is an international nonprofit with 4 US locations and 2 international locations who has been in Greeley since 2012. SWB uses soccer as a vehicle of change to help refugee and immigrant students overcome obstacles to growth, inclusion, and personal success. They provide year-round soccer programming, combined with English language support, academic enrichment, and mentorship opportunities to students and their families. SWB currently serves middle school and high school youth from a diverse range of countries including Honduras, Guatemala, Burma, Eritrea, Republic of Congo, and Somalia.

We have a unique opportunity to partner with Soccer Without Borders to provide support for their work in the following ways:

- Excited about helping newcomer youth learn English and thrive academically? Volunteer with SWB as a tutor! Hours are mostly in the afterschool time but are flexible.
- Interested in working one-on-one with a newcomer and their family? Volunteer to be a Family Mentor and help participants and their families acclimate to their new community! Mentor activities could involve tutoring English, outings to parks or museums, sharing a meal together, and other activities to help the family navigate life in the United States. Hours are flexible with a minimum commitment of 9 months (2+ hrs/wk).
- Passionate about soccer, and want a chance to get out on the field with a group of equally passionate youth? Join SWB as an assistant soccer coach! Choose a weekday that works with your schedule, and join our coaching team! Hours: 3:30-6 or 4:30-7.

One Parent's Reflection on the Christmas Pageant

"That was one of the loveliest pageants we've ever attended - it was so joyful and inclusive - I saw so many small acts of kindness going on, from letting baby Jesus' mom sit on stage to make sure that was not a scary experience for her little one to the narrator picking up and comforting her younger sibling during her reading. I loved the star with one arm out of his costume so he could hang onto his pretzels and the other star's spontaneous dancing and wiggling with delight. I grew up in the church mindset of 'make everyone sit still and do it right!' which led to less messiness but also significantly less joy and, most importantly, less love. It was a privilege for my child to have the opportunity to practice prioritizing demonstrating kindness and love (for another child) over worrying about whether her costume fit perfectly - that to me is the true meaning of Christmas!"



Update on Staff Transitions

Goodbyes: In December we said our goodbyes to Brady Ross (Youth Minister) and Jackie Russo (Financial Secretary). We are so grateful for Brady and Jackie's time with us. Current Job Searches:

Pastoral Care Associate: This is an 8-10 hour per week position that will help Rev. Ben and Rev. Tamara meet the pastoral care needs of our community.

Director of Youth Ministries: This is a 6-8 hour per week position that will be responsible for organizing weekly gatherings for our middle and high schoolers. This position will also help lead retreats and mission trips.

Youth Ministry Update

The face of Youth Ministry at FCC is changing, and we are excited about this new look! Our ministers recognize that youth thrive with consistency and connection. With that in mind, the Revs. Ben and Tamara will be stepping into a leadership role with our Youth Ministry program. They will alternate leading the group on Sunday mornings during the 10am worship service and Rev. Ben will lead the Wednesday Night Live gathering each week at 6:30pm. We hope to hire a part-time Director of Youth Ministries to work with us and act as a support for our youth programming. While we are still hammering out details around Confirmation (more to come soon!) we are eager to deepen our connection with the wonderful youth of this church.
