# **Advent: A Season of Listening**

Advent (the 4 weeks leading up to Christmas) is a liturgical season of waiting and an opportunity to practice spiritual listening. Year after year, the Church waits and wonders, even though waiting is hard (counter-cultural, even). As the days grow shorter, there is an invitation to slow down, to make room for God to birth a new thing within us and within our community. And so we wait for the rebirth of light, the rebirth of love, the rebirth of hope into our lives.

# **Sponsorship for Humanitarian Parole**

The Outreach Ministry Group, in partnership with the Humanitarian Legal Assistance Project, is offering an opportunity to be a sponsor for Humanitarian Parole to Afghan Refugees. Since the U.S. embassy in Kabul has closed and there are no U.S. consulates operating in Afghanistan, it is impossible for many Afghan nationals to complete their visa applications. One of their only options to receive necessary travel documents to get to the U.S. is to apply for humanitarian parole.

Humanitarian parole is a temporary form of immigration relief that is granted at the discretion of a U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services (USCIS) officer determining whether the applicant's parole into the U.S. would be a significant public benefit or is necessary due to an emergency.

At this time, humanitarian parole cannot be granted without a sponsor. A sponsor is a person or organization that financially guarantees the applicant (beneficiary) will not become a public charge while they are in the U.S. on humanitarian parole. Any individual in or outside the U.S. can sponsor humanitarian parole applicants, but U.S. citizens are by far the best sponsors in the eyes of a USCIS officer. To be a sponsor, individuals must meet 100% of the Federal Poverty Guidelines for their household.
