capital campaign

A year and a half ago, we began a visioning process to discern God's calling for our community as we move into our next 150 years of ministry. Over two hundred members of our church engaged in a number of gatherings with John Laster, Vice President of Horizons Stewardship. Out of these dynamic and hope-filled conversations emerged a picture of a church that seeks to be known by our extravagant welcome; openness to thoughtful, authentic, and honest spiritual exploration; commitment to our children and youth; positive impact on our wider-community; and exemplary music.

As excitement built around these conversations about how God was moving FCC into the future, we began to consider how we could turn our dreams and convictions of being "In Greeley for Good" into a reality. To that end, we initiated a process to discern the possibility of engaging in a capital campaign as a community. We hosted additional gatherings with John Laster for conversation, questions, and to assess levels of support among members. The feasibility study conducted by John following these gatherings indicated widely shared excitement and hope for how a capital campaign could be instrumental in helping us pursue our dreams as a congregation.

Things were really just beginning to pick up steam when the pandemic hit. Church leadership wisely determined that the capital campaign would temporarily be put on hold.

Last fall, our church's Cabinet and Trustees determined it was time for us to restart our movement toward a capital campaign. Since then, in consultation with John, your church leadership and staff have been laying the groundwork for our church's "In Greeley for Good" capital campaign that will take place this fall.

Meet Our New Staff Members!

Dr. Derek Chester, Minister of Music

Praised by the New York Times for his "beautifully shaped and carefully nuanced singing" Derek Chester, tenor, has quickly established himself as a preeminent teacher of the vocal arts. Dr. Chester received his bachelor's degree in Vocal Performance from the University of Georgia and his Master's Degree in Vocal Performance of Oratorio, Early Music, Song, and Chamber Music on full scholarship from the Yale School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music. As a Fulbright Scholar, he spent a year in Germany working as a freelance musician and furthering his training. He received his DMA in Voice Performance and Opera Studies with full scholarship and a graduate teaching fellowship from the University of North Texas, with a dissertation on the juvenile song compositions of Samuel Barber.

He currently serves as tenured Associate Professor of Voice at the University of Northern Colorado where he has worked since 2013 and is a featured soloist at the Staunton Music Festival and the Colorado Bach Festival. Despite his focus on academia, Chester continues his worldwide career as a sought-after interpreter of classical repertoire. Chester is a conductor at heart and is currently expanding that part of his creative output. He has served as our Director of Adult Choirs since January 2020 and has conducted UNC's early music vocal and instrumental ensemble, the Ursa Consort, for the last seven years.



Tammi Van Drunen, Children's Minister

Tammi Van Drunen (she/her) is a Michigan native who has called Greeley home for over a decade. She graduated from Calvin University with a double major in Psychology and Spanish and followed that with an M.Div from Western Theological Seminary (Holland, MI). She's married to Phil who does all manner of web and video things and is also the home cook. Together, they love hanging out with their two elementary age kids. When the kids aren't keeping her busy, she loves reading, doodling, and attempting to keep plants alive outside.

She deeply believes that children are already on a spiritual journey. The grown-ups' job is to make spaces for kids to meet God in ways that make sense to them. Children's prayer practices and play languages have allowed Tammi to meet God in new ways. Her favorite prayer practice is blowing bubbles.



Brady Ross, Youth Minister

Brady Ross (he/him) is honored to be joining the staff at First Congregational Church. Raised in the UCC, Brady has been at camp and in youth programs in the church his whole life. He spent his college years working in the youth programs at Wayzata Community Church (Wayzata, MN) and the Wayzata Community Church summer camp. He believes youth ministry should include music, fun, and unconditional love.

During the COVID outbreak, Brady worked with Vote Common Good, a national tour to push Christians closer to radical love and justice. Before he joins the staff here, he will spend his summer guiding canoe trips in the Boundary Waters Canoe Area in Minnesota. Brady's ministry is heavily influenced by a quote from Marianne Williamson, who says, "Our deepest fear is not that we are inadequate, but that we are powerful beyond measure."
